Few industry events feature an island tour as the first stop on the agenda. On September 18, however, more than 50 participants made their way to Manitoulin Island for a special tour of Lafarge Canada Inc.'s Meldrum Bay Quarry as part of OSSGA's annual Operations Tour.

"I have never attended one of these tours before and I could not believe (OSSGA) packed so much into two days!" said Lowell Brown of V. J. Pamensky Canada Inc. "It was interesting to see how the Lafarge guarry had expanded over the last few years."

Located on the west end of Manitoulin Island in the northern part of Lake Huron, Lafarge's marine quarry marked the official kick-off to a two-day tour featuring five other outstanding aggregate operations in northern Ontario.

Meldrum Bay Quarry (see photo 1 below) • began operations in 1980 by Seeley and Arnil Construction and was purchased by Lafarge in 1986. Today, the quarry ships dolomitic limestone throughout Canada and the United States along the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence River.


Other sites on the tour included:

- Pioneer Construction Inc., where participants visited the granite quarry, concrete plant, cement rail delivery system, storage area and shop
- **Atlas Copco Mining and Rock** Excavation (see photo 2 below), where attendees witnessed how quality key parts are made available at optimal efficiency
- Rail-Veyor Technologies Global (see photo 3 below), demonstrating how quickly, quietly and safely Rail-Veyor transports materials at its

- **Grant Aggregate & Industrial** Supply Inc. (see photo 4 below), featuring a tour of a combined 40,000 square feet of manufacturing and warehousing space
- Bot Construction Group (see cover photo) and its work on a large-scale project south of Sudbury that includes a four-lane expansion of Hwy. 69 over 11.2 km.

"The tour gave me a new appreciation for the great expense a contractor goes to when constructing a highway through rugged terrain," added Brown. "I was particularly interested to see how waterways were kept from being contaminated with foreign material."

OSSGA ARA Workshop & More

AGGREGATE RESOURCES ACT REVIEW WORKSHOP:

Following a lengthy review process, the Ontario Legislature's Standing Committee on General Government recently tabled a report on its review of the *Aggregate Resources Act* (ARA), proposing 38 recommendations in the following areas:

- Improved Public Information on Aggregate Operations
- Licencing Procedures and Associated Matters
- Review of Licences
- Use of Recycled Aggregate Materials
- Municipal Land Use Planning Responsibilities
- Aggregate Operations & Agricultural Land
- Cumulative Impact
- Rehabilitation of Former Sites
- Alternative Modes of Transport

Given the magnitude of this undertaking (the last major revision to the ARA was made in 1997) and its implications for the aggregate industry, OSSGA provided an opportunity for its members on November 28 and again on December 6 to help shape the association's official position on the recommendations.

Hosted by OSSGA's Land Use Committee, the two sessions began with an overview of the proposed changes contained within the report, followed by facilitated workshops where participants had an opportunity to ask questions and discuss the recommendations in detail.




